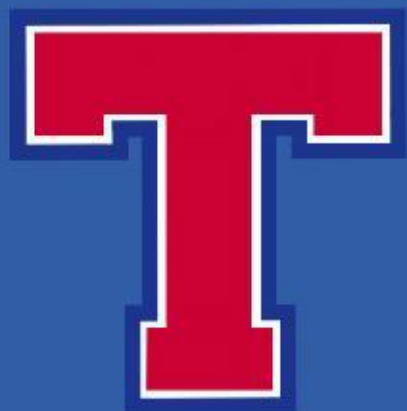

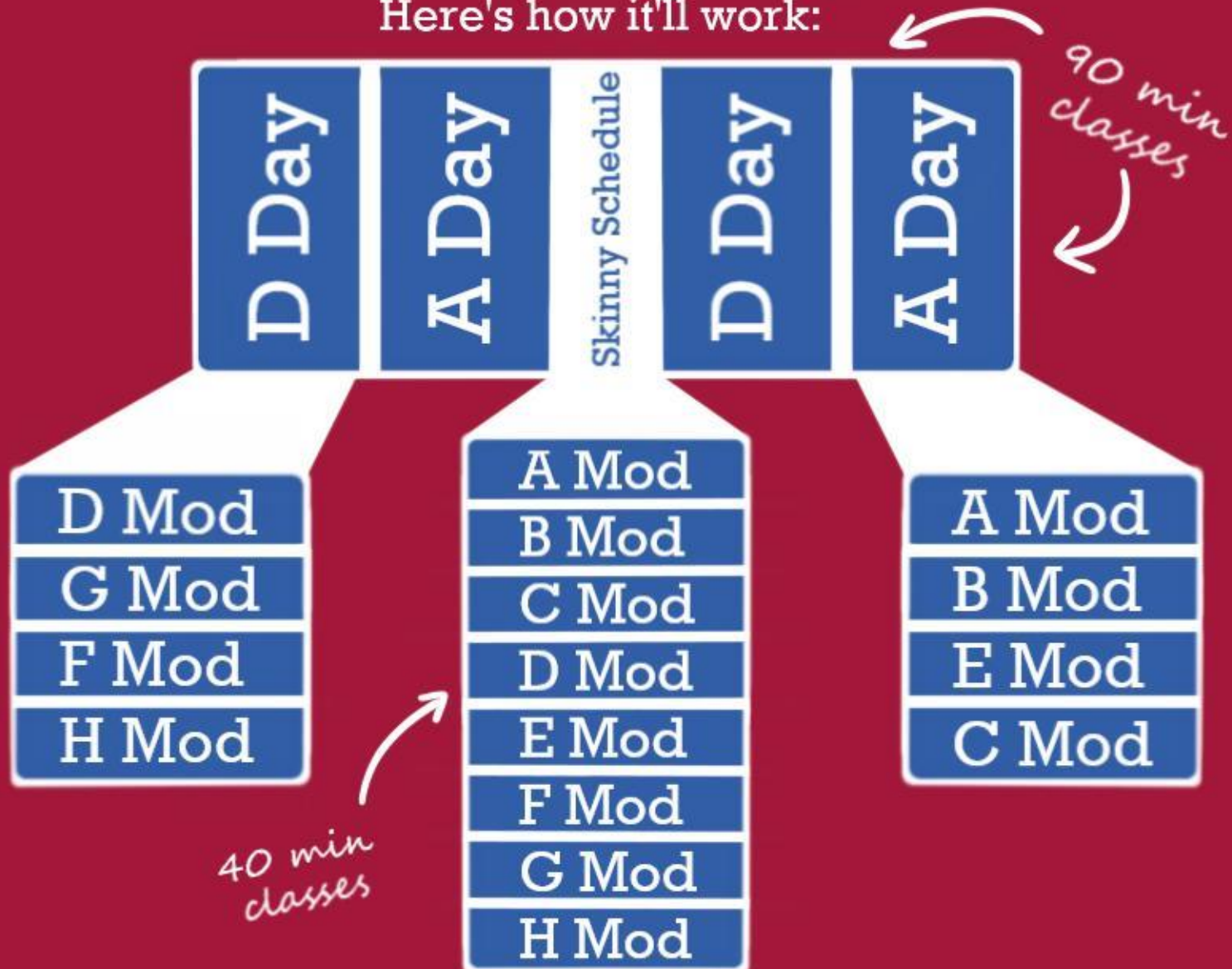

SCHEDULE

First thing's first: let's get acquainted with the daily schedule. It can seem confusing at first, but don't worry - you'll get the hang of it sooner than you think! It's a little different this year because of the pandemic.

Here's how it'll work:



Each day has four lunch mods - you'll find out more about when yours is once you arrive at school and get your schedule.

SCHEDULE

For future reference, here's how the pre-pandemic class rotation schedule works:

A Day	A B	Homeroom	C	D, Lunch, E, F or D, E, Lunch, F	GH
B Day	B C		G		HA
C Day	C G		H		AB
G Day	GH		A		BC
H Day	HA		B		CG

For example, if you have first lunch and it's a B day, your schedule would go as follows:

B, C, Homeroom, G, D, Lunch, E, F, H, A

If you have second lunch and it's a G day, your schedule would be:

G, H, Homeroom, A, D, E, Lunch, F, B, C

It still might seem a bit confusing, but when we eventually return to this type of schedule rotation, you'll get used to it quickly. In the meantime, if you're ever unsure, just ask a teacher or upperclassman which mod is next!

FINDING YOUR WAY AROUND

It can be helpful to write down the room numbers of your classes so you can locate them on the go. Here's a quick guide to make navigation a little easier:

3rd Floor	300s	Blue	Science	It's science! What more could you want!?	⬅

Tip: Blue floors have boys' restrooms, red floors have girls' restrooms.
