Sponsored by the Roman Catholic Diocese of Manchester, Trinity opened its doors in September of 1970 as a consolidation of three parent high schools: Bishop Bradley (1951), Immaculata (1965) and Saint Anthony (1934). Trinity High School works collaboratively within the catholic school system. Trinity High School maintains a relationship with other area educational and service organizations and continually seeks to enhance its programs through a variety of cooperative ventures.

Students come from over 42 communities in New Hampshire. The majority are from the greater Manchester area. While approximately 70% of our students are of the Catholic faith, students of other faiths are welcome. Acceptance and placement are based on demonstrated academic performance, teacher recommendations and placement exams.

Curriculum

As a college preparatory high school, Trinity High School, offers a liberal arts program which requires that students take a minimum of six credits each semester and earn a Physical Education credit. Our core curriculum requires students to take Theology, English, and Mathematics, each year. AP classes are offered in English, Mathematics, and Social Studies. Honors and College Preparatory classes are offered in English, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, World Language and Art.

Students who select Honors level classes must receive a grade of an A or above in their College Preparatory class as well as a teacher recommendation. Freshmen must receive an above average score on the THS placement test and receive the recommendation of their 8th grade instructor.
