McHugh Foundation Establishes Endowed Scholarship at Trinity

Kevin McHugh '52 (Bishop Bradley HS) passed away in 1992. He was a dedicated family man and businessman in Manchester, and a great benefactor of Trinity. The Foundation was established in the mid-90's to honor Kevin's memory and to benefit Trinity students with financial need. The Foundation raised and invested the proceeds from the annual THS/Kevin McHugh Golf Tournament. Over the years, the Foundation has donated over a million dollars to help students obtain a Trinity education.

In the Fall of '21, the Foundation made its last gift of over \$97,000 to Trinity High School. In addition, the Foundation Trustees established an endowed scholarship, the Kevin McHugh '52 Memorial Scholarship, at Trinity with a gift of \$25,000.
