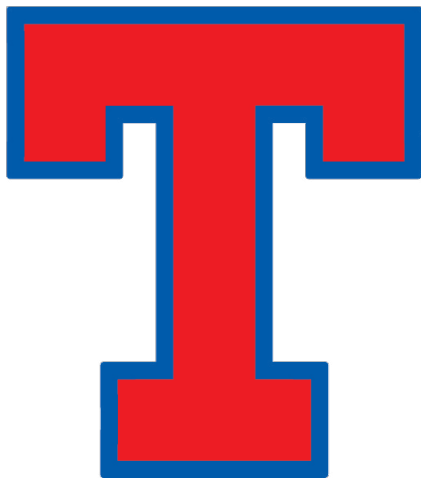


HONOR CELEBRATE PIONEER

Phase One of this project will offer bold amenities and resources for students, teachers, and staff. Some of the highlights include:

- Improved traffic flow and parking;
- Brand new main entrance and lobby;
- Exterior building enhancements;
- Energy efficient upgrades and ADA accessibility with elevator;
- An all-new junior high wing;
- New offices and features for campus ministry, guidance, school nurse, robotics and science;
- Upgraded locker rooms, cafeteria, and kitchen;
- An all-new gym entrance and lobby.



Phase Two will bring a Junior High gymnasium and performing arts center as well as a larger chapel and worship space. These are just some of the features of this extraordinary project – which is set to create an incredible educational facility rich in Catholic identity.
